Curated by the University Writing Program, this annual project honors and presents work by students majoring in practically every department and program on campus. Year after year, the student essays in *Prized Writing* have been used as teaching tools by instructors both here and outside UC Davis. Instructors have discovered in the *Prized Writing* online archive of essays a repository of inspiring models.
